2011 Community Survey

In order to assess some important issues regarding the quality of life in Marathon County that are not currently being measured, the LIFE Steering Committee issued a survey to Marathon County residents in April of 2011.

4,100 surveys were mailed to randomly selected Marathon County residents using U.S. mail zip codes. In addition, 150 surveys were issued to The Neighbors' Place and The Hmong Association for completion in client interviews ensuring representation of minority populations of Marathon County.

854 mailed responses were returned and 29 client interview responses to the survey yielded an outstanding 20.8% survey return rate (883 survey responses/4,250 surveys issued). The outstanding survey response rate results in a low 2% to 3% margin of error allowing the LIFE Steering Committee to tailor the LIFE Report to our community's concerns and priorities.

The 21.8% return rate is outstanding compared to most surveys, which hope for a 20% return rate.

The data obtained from the community survey represent the viewpoints of those who responded. The survey is not representative of Marathon County's population. Responses represented by the survey results are not generalizable. It is also important to note that not all respondents answered all questions completely and may have not responded to some of the questions at all. The percentage calculations shown are the percentages of the total responses to each question. If a question was not responded to on a given survey it is not included in the totals used to calculate percentages.

- Weighted average for individual items on the lists are calculated on a bipolar scale (-2 to 2) by assigning values of -2 for strongly disagree, -1 for disagree, 0 for Don't Know, +1 for agree and +2 for strongly agree, and then averaging the result. A positive mean will indicate that respondents, on average, agreed with the statement. A negative mean will indicate that respondents, on average, disagreed with the statement. The larger the absolute value of the mean, the stronger the agreement or disagreement was for respondents on average.
- The Top 3 areas that respondents indicated most needed to be addressed or improved in each list are **BOLDED**.
